During this 1 ½ hour workshop, teachers will learn why they should participate in the heritage fairs program, see examples of successful student inquiry-based projects and take away practical ideas and activities to help them integrate social studies, history and geography expectations with those in language and the arts.

*The workshop will be delivered in English but student worksheets will be available in both English and French.

Historical Story Telling Workshop

Effective communication of history is really just good story telling. In this half-day workshop, explore the ways we tease out the threads of stories from the objects, places, and people involved. Led by a group of local museum professionals, students will develop their skills of storytelling in order to create effective and captivating videos for their Young Citizen projects.

Film Lab Workshop
